#### IFAA MISSION

The lowa Foundation for Agricultural Advancement (IFAA) is a non-profit organization comprised of agricultural enthusiasts dedicated to providing scholarships, financial awards and incentives for college-bound lowa (4-H and FFA) youth seeking a post-secondary education in the area of agriculture.

A key means of providing this support has been through partnerships with FFA and lowa 4-H. Each year, thousands of lowa students participate in 4-H and FFA beef, swine, sheep poultry and other agricultural projects. IFAA's role is to provide scholarships and other financial awards to college-bound lowa youth with ag interests.

IFAA's primary programs are the Sale of Champions, which is done in conjunction with the annual lowa State Fair, and the Winner's Circle Scholarship and Awards program. The Sale of Champions program gives sixteen FFA and 4-H exhibitors the privilege to sell their champion livestock and poultry projects. The Winner's Circle Scholarship program was established in 1990 to provide incentives for college-bound lowa youth seeking a post-secondary education in any area of agriculture.

#### CARCASS REQUIREMENTS

Upon completion of the Sale of Champions, animals will be transported to lowa State University Ames, lowa for carcass evaluation and drug testing in accordance with the lowa State Fair rules. Processing will be done at no expense to the purchaser. The champion carcasses may be viewed on Saturday, August 26, 2023 anytime from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the ISU Meat Lab. You must have clean, close-toed shoes and clean clothes. Everyone will be required to wear frocks, hairnets and walk through a foot disinfectant in order to participate. #### CHAMPIONSHIP REWARDS

Sale of Champions exhibitors will receive a check from IFAA after satisfactory results have been reported by the ISU Meat Laboratory. The exhibitor keeps 75% of the proceeds and the remaining 25% is available for scholarships and IFAA administrative expenses. Checks are mailed to exhibitors as soon as all sale funds are collected and drug testing is completed. All Local Support funds are due by August 31st. Any uncollected funds will be deducted from the exhibitor's sale check.

#### ATTENTION BUYERS

Purchasers hereby are expressly given notice that any animal purchased at the 4-H/FFA Sale of Champions will be subject to the following condition of said sale:

A purchaser, any other person, or any other entity shall be prohibited from taking any genetic material from any animal purchased at the 4-H/FFA Sale of Champions.

IFAA requests settlement for livestock purchases immediately following the Sale of Champions. At the completion of the sale, please report to the IFAA Treasurer at the sale block for paperwork.

#### **Our Story**

For as long as the Iowa State Fair has been in existence, youth from around the state have exhibited their livestock projects with pride at the Iowa State Fairgrounds in search of a purple banner. Until the late 1980s, the kids who earned the right to be called Grand Champion were often rewarded with less than market price for their animals. In 1987 at the conclusion of another dismal sale of the champion animals, a group of livestock industry members decided a change was in order to not only reward the hard work of the grand champion projects but to provide more incentive for others to participate in raising livestock projects. In 1988, the Iowa Foundation for Agricultural Advancement was born.

The original mission was simply to provide a base level of funds to support the sale of grand and reserve champion projects for the major species at a premium. After years of success growing the Sale of Champions into the envy of many state fairs around the country, IFAA expanded giving to include scholarship programs and performance awards in order to reach more youth.

Today, the IFAA offers over \$200,000 per year in scholarships funded by groups such as the Governor of Iowa, Bruce Rastetter, Sinclair Tractor, Cargill, Rain and Hail Insurance, HyVee, Fareway, and ISF Beef Champion Supporters to name a few. Support for the IFAA Sale of Champions and subsequent scholarship and awards programs has steadily grown from \$50,000 in the first year to nearly over \$900,000 today.

"My family is humbled and thankful for the support that the IFAA offers to youth in agriculture. We've had the opportunity to earn a spot in the Sale of Champions, benefiting from the sale and breaking a record not once, but twice. My sisters and I have also been recipients of IFAA scholarships. Three out of four Marek girls pursued a degree in agriculture and were benefactors of IFAA scholarships. The IFAA has positively affected me and each of my sisters in various ways. We are forever grateful for the businesses and individuals who support this organization, as it truly has made a substantial impact on our future and supported our paths to joining the agriculture industry."
