The Iowa Foundation for Agricultural Advancement (IFAA) is a non-profit organization of agriculture enthusiasts dedicated to providing scholarships, financial awards and incentives for college-bound Iowa (4-H and FFA) youth seeking a post-secondary education in agriculture.

A key means of providing this support has been through partnerships with FFA and 4-H. Each year, thousands of Iowa students participate in 4-H and FFA livestock and agricultural projects. IFAA provides scholarships and other financial awards to college-bound Iowa youth with agricultural interests.

IFAA's primary programs are the Sale of Champions, held in conjunction with the annual Iowa State Fair, and the Winner's Circle Scholarship and Awards programs. The Sale of Champions gives 16 FFA and 4-H exhibitors the opportunity to sell their champion livestock and poultry projects. The Winner's Circle Scholarship and Awards program was established in 1990 to provide incentives for college-bound Iowa youth pursuing a post-secondary education in agriculture.
